We have another potential opportunity for a **missions trip over Labor Day Weekend**, working in Newport, TN. This area was devastated by Hurricane Helene in September 2024. They have had less attention than other areas and remain in great need of help. We would be working with a local long-term recovery team. Our project would be coordinated by the Midsouth GMC Disaster Relief Coordinator, Pastor Suzanne Whittaker. We are awaiting information on what possible projects might include.

The feasibility, cost, and details of this trip are entirely dependent on the people interested in going and completely customizable. - -Newport is just past Gatlinburg, approximately 4.5 hours drive from Bowling Green. There is a GMC church there that would be happy to host us we would need to bring air mattresses/cots/etc. We could also rent an Airbnb there are several affordable high-capacity rentals in the area.
- -We would be responsible for our own meals. We can decide together how we want to handle those perhaps to have breakfast and lunch supplies available, and to either cook together or go for dinner somewhere together.
- -The church bus can accommodate up to 15 people, or can we take separate cars.

The missions team is considering an **international missions trip in 2026**, either to a partner ministry in the summer of 2026 or to Johannesburg to do missions projects with other GMC volunteers during General Conference Aug 30-Sept 5 2026. Please begin praying now about whether you would be interested in doing this!

"The Little Note That Made a Big Difference"

I got a text from my neighbor friends sharing a picture of a small handwritten note. She said, "This is on Facebook. It says it was found in Hidden River. I thought maybe Tim wrote this to Noah. They're holding onto it in case Noah wants it back." What unfolded reminds me of the <u>Guideposts</u> magazine article called "His Mysterious Ways."

Immediately, I recognized Tim's handwriting. It indeed was a note that Tim wrote to our oldest son Noah back in March. A man named Alex, who does lawn work in our neighborhood found it. It choked him up, so he took it home. When he showed his neighbor, she decided to post it online to see if it could be returned. People began commenting on the post, wondering if friends could have written the note, wondering if it could be to a Noah they knew. Others said that they wanted to be adopted by Noah's dad. Some talked about los-

ing their own dads wishing they could have just one last note in his handwriting. Others poured out their grief because the dads who raised them did not love them like they saw in the words written. Then something cool happened, people started encouraging one an-



Others began to share about the love of God and how it is there for all of us, and can be found where people gather as families of faith.
