Easter Season

"He (Jesus) said to them, 'What things?'" Luke 24:19 (CEB)

In the season of Easter, we find ourselves looking back to understand what to do moving forward. The resurrection of Jesus is of such importance that we cannot help but look back in grateful adoration of our true Savior, Jesus Christ. As I look back on Holy Week, I am appreciative of the services we were able to participate in. The midday services at Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Easter Egg Hunt & meal, Maundy Thursday Communion & foot washing, Good Friday Tenebrae, Sunrise, and our Easter morning services.

The passage above is Jesus' conversation with the two disciples walking to Emmaus. They are not looking to the future because they are unable to truly consider the immediate past or their present reality. They are sad and unable to understand why Jesus died and what it means that the women told them they had seen him resurrected.

I wonder how many of us find ourselves like the two men walking to Emmaus. We've experienced something great in the resurrection but do not really understand how that helps us moving forward. Maybe we simply celebrated Easter because that's what we do. I want to challenge us to consider Christ's resurrection as the impetus for all decisions we make moving forward. How do the decisions we make proclaim the resurrection of Christ and how do they further his kingdom in our lives and in the lives of others?

Over the coming weeks we will continue looking at the Apostles' Creed and what it teaches us about who God is and what God does. We will continue to consider what it is we believe and proclaim week in and week out. We will consider how each phrase continues to call us back to Christ.

Who knows...maybe as we continue to look back on Christ's resurrection, we may find ourselves walking alongside Christ without even knowing it. How beautiful it would be to realize we have been walking alongside the Savior of the world.

May we continue to be the Easter people Christ calls us to be. May we seek not to understand all that took place, but to simply share what we know to those who do not yet know.


