Happy New Year! I love this time of year. One reason I love the new year is that I get to purchase a new Bible. For those who do not know, I read through the Bible every year, and over the last decade I have read through the Bible in a different translation each year. This year, I will spend my devotional time in the New English Translation (NET). I am also excited because it is my very great hope that I will read through the entire Bible differently this year, and alongside many of you.

I have adapted the reading plan I typically use and turned it into a 2026 Scripture Reading Plan booklet. Several church members have helped me organize it, and Michael and Emily Romans have helped format it and make it far more beautiful than I would have made it. I am grateful for the assistance of those who helped.

We will have these booklets available to everyone ahead of 2026 (hopefully by December 28, 2025). Over the course of the year, we will read the entire Old Testament together. In the first half of 2026 we will also read through the entirety of the Psalms. In the second half of the year, we will read through the entirety of the New Testament. Every Sunday in 2026 you will read one of the Old Testament passages and either the sermon text I will preach from that day or one of the lectionary passages for that day.

I cannot tell you how excited I am about reading through the Bible along with you. I hope that those of you who regularly read scripture might find this a nice adaptation or change to your regular routine. For those of you who, maybe, do not read scripture as regularly, I pray this becomes a useful and fruitful tool for your continued growth.

Scripture is a living document. It is the very Word of God. That same Word became flesh and dwelt among us: Jesus Christ. As we read this year, as we worship together, may our faith grow, may our connection with God and one another deepen, and may we see Christ more clearly.






CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



In all seriousness, we all have an important part to play in God's work. And God distributes our giftedness and function within the Body according to a design that makes sense to Him. If we are wise (or just too old to waste precious energy and brain cells), it behooves us to try and understand His way of doing things. I want to be on His page! I'm guessing you do as well.

As we begin this new year, let's make a resolution to not waste ourselves on service that doesn't profit the Kingdom of God. Let's resolve to do Kingdom work in a Kingdom way! This year I am introducing a teaching seminar that helps participants learn not only what their spiritual gifts are, but how to use them in the context of our local church family. That is what Network is all about. It is about serving God and the church in a way that glorifies God and builds up the church. In a way that fills us with joy because we are serving exactly the way we are designed to serve! No more suffering for Jesus by serving in ways that make you want to stab yourself in the eye repeatedly! (You think I jest.) No, serving God should reflect the joy God feels in serving us in the Trinity. God has great joy in being our Father; Jesus has great joy in being our Savior and Redeemer; the Holy Spirit has great joy in being our Comforter, Counselor, and Equipper. My favorite big theology word that describes this is Perichoresis (you should look it up). Often it is described as a Divine dance.

Don't you think this is what God would have for us in our serving with one another? That we are entering into the joy and exhilaration of the Divine dance that is happening within and around us all the time, bringing forth the Kingdom of God? I will be offering it in my WD2 teaching time slot at 4pm, or as a couple of short retreats at the church, and maybe even in the Sunday School hour!
